RESOLUTION - FLAG DESECRATION

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Unincorporated Town of Round Mountain, County of Nye, State of Nevada, at a regular meeting held on the 11th day of December, 1990 at seven o'clock (7:00) p.m. determined that:

WHEREAS, the American Flag represents the very soul of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the American Flag is a most honorable and worthy banner of a great nation thankful for its strength and committed to curing its faults; and

WHEREAS, the American Flag has been burned, spit on and otherwise defiled by protesters who turn against this nation's ideals of freedom and justice; and

WHEREAS, it is the belief of many law-abiding American citizens that the nation's banner should be fully protected against such violation.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of Round Mountain, goes on record as fully supporting the Nevada Department of the American Legion in its campaign to protect the American Flag by means of appropriate amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

AND, FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that this body fully supports a memorializing resolution to be presented to the 1991 Nevada Legislature urging Congress to propose a constitutional amendment prohibiting desecration of the Flag of the United States of America.

AND FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board urges members of the 1991 Legislature, convening in Carson City in mid-January, 1991, to act quickly and decisively in passing such a resolution so that Nevada can be one of the first of the 38 states needed to bring about the constitutional change desired.
