8. Continued from the April 22,2025 Meeting (For Possible action) Discussion, deliberation to adopt, amend and adopt, or reject the fiscal year 2025 and 2026. Public Safety sales and tax use (PSST) plan for the Town of Round Mountain.

“The question was asked, do we or will we have in the very near future a permanently assigned ground mountain deputy? The answer that I gave at that point was that I said that a deputy was about to graduate from field training and that, yes, that deputy would be assigned. I misunderstood what was being relayed back and forth between us from a text message.” (Sheriff Joe McGill)

“The deputy did just graduate from field training, but that deputy was not slated for permanent assignment to ground mountain. She was assigned for a permanent assignment to Tonopah, which also serves ground mountain, if that's the way you want to describe it. As I said in April, we have a very, very hard time hiring people who want to live here in Round Mountain and want to work here in Round Mountain.

And so that is our, that's our quandary. So, the long and the short to answer your question, we don't have anybody who is currently, other than Detective Rumker, assigned ground mountain and lives in round mountain. We don't have anybody slated for Round Mountain at this point.

We always do have advertisements out there for applicants. And the more practical way for us to do that is to divide them by the area of assignment. So, we post a posting specifically for Pahrump.

We have a post for Amargosa Beatty. We have a posting for round mountain. We have a posting for Tonopah.

I'm the area commander for this area. Okay.

We asked her to reach out for us, to email us the call, the date that this happened. We have yet to receive that email Okay. I have gone through call logs from December until today. The only calls I have at bars is Cousin Kurt's and at Citizens Assist for problems that he's having with his landlord. I cannot find that call.

Okay. (10:25) I urge her, I mean, urge her to reach out to us, urge her to send me that email. (10:29) I'll leave my business card.

She can send me the email directly. Okay. If it is a three-hour response time, somebody's going to be written up.

Because we have a lot of experienced cops out here that came from Nye County and went other places and then came back to Nye County. And my brother, including, retired from Nye County as a lieutenant, area commander for a total of—And we have seen response times that are ridiculous. It should not take an hour or even an hour and a half to get from Tonopah to out here.

To summarize there are not enough Police to come and patrol Round Mountain due to the area being too rural and Sheriff Joe McGill being shorthanded. With that we have Rumker who Is a local cop in town and with his scheduled hours he patrols during those given times. In the meantime, it is possible that with good advertising and leadership from Sheriff McGill and better living accommodation it may become a want to help our small community.

_____ So the items you have under PSST (50:40) can be the ones for those. (50:42) Absolutely. (50:45) So, the (50:48) proposed spending plan (50:52) First of all, (50:54) there was a (50:56) a supplement (51:03) What's the word I'm looking for? (51:05) Amended.

(51:06) Amended. An amendment. Thank you.

(51:07) For 2025. (51:09) And that was because of an increase in costs (51:13) for our cellular service (51:17) which operates the computers in the cars (51:22) as well as the modems in the cars (51:26) to run the body cameras and the car cameras. (51:33) That increase of cost (51:36) was the (51:38) the Round Mountain portion of that was \$891.

(51:44) And that's based on population (51:47) of 803 people. (51:48) Whether that's accurate or not, that's from a county. (51:51) The best I can give you.

(51:54) So it was \$891. (51:56) That was the amendment. (52:00) The spending plan for fiscal year 26 (52:02) is nothing more than annual costs (52:06) for items that have been approved (52:08) in previous fiscal years.

(52:11) So the first item, lens lock, (52:13) that's our body cams and car cams. (52:15) That was approved in fiscal year 23. (52:19) Year 3 of the 5-year contract, (52:22) the Round Mountain portion is \$4,534.

(52:26) The second item is cradle point, (52:29) which is the modem (52:30) that operates the computers in the cars. (52:35) That was approved in fiscal year 2017. (52:37) The Round Mountain portion for this year, (52:39) upcoming year, is \$36.

(52:41) You can't barely go two people (52:44) to McDonald's for \$36. (52:48) Especially here, (52:50) since you've got to go all the way (52:51) to Hawthorne or Perot. (52:54) The next item is Verizon, (52:57) which is the cell phone service, (52:59) which was approved in 2017 fiscal year.

(53:03) The annual cost for that is \$733. (53:07) The next item was (53:11) for body cams, (53:13) which was approved in fiscal year 23. (53:17) The cost of that is \$781.

(53:24) ECR, which is the fingerprint machine (53:26) that we use as a digital scanning machine (53:28) in Tonopah and Perot. (53:32) That was approved in fiscal year 2017. (53:35) This year's amount is \$22.

(53:38) CPI Guardian, (53:39) which is the big vacuum sealer bag (53:41) that we use to put the stinky clothes in (53:43) in the jails. (53:45) That was approved in fiscal year 2021. (53:48) This year's cost is \$36.

(53:50) We have no proposed new PSSD costs (53:55) for fiscal year 26 at this time. (53:58) Because we have no answers. (53:59) Pretty easy.

(54:00) Jesus. (54:06) So this is open to public comment also (54:09) because it's a four-action item. (54:15) Public comment? Stumpy? (54:23) I think Sarah's done.

(54:27) She wants to go home. (54:29) I'm late for softball practice. Would you do me a favor, Joe? (54:33) You've got Jim's number, (54:36) the town hall, whatever.
 (54:38) Send me something on the cost (54:41) of the deputy. (54:44) Wages. (54:48) Whatever.
 (54:49) Just so I can have something to work from. (54:52) Are you going to sponsor? (55:10) So yeah, if you could shoot that to Jim. (55:15) Can we stick to the agenda item? (55:19) I'll make a motion that we approve the (55:22) number eight, (55:24) and adopt the rejector, whatever.
 (55:33) The total? (55:35) The total? (55:36) \$6,142. (55:38) Okay. (55:40) I'll make a motion.
 (55:42) \$6,142. (55:46) That we approve the \$6,142 (55:49) from the PSST, (55:53) PSST tax. (55:55) I'll send you that.

9. (For possible action) discussion, deliberation and possible decision regarding 4th July 2025 softball tournament.

Lacey Baker, B-A-K-E-R. (58:12) So, talking with some of the people who do the adult softball, Octavia and Troy, (58:18) and Cale's the one who's actually brought this to us.
 (58:21) We've talked about doing it on the backside of the softball field, (58:26) and we would probably rent a big dumpster to put back there for that time, (58:31) just to eliminate all the trash. (58:35) I think that's, I mean, I don't know that there's really a whole lot other to it. (58:38) We will hopefully, you know, that will be good for our restaurants, our businesses.
 (58:43) We'll be able, you know, they're going to get gas here, (58:45) they're going to get food here, the grocery store, or things like that. (58:49) And then to make the tournament itself hopefully more of a success (58:54) and give no one any heat stroke. (58:57) So the tournament's on 4th of July, right? (58:59) That's what it's looking like.
 (59:00) I think actually they're going to try to do it not on the 4th, (59:03) but the day before or the day after, (59:05) because of how many activities already go on on the 4th. (59:09) So when we went to the meeting up at the mine for the 4th of July, (59:14) there is talk of doing a trap shoot that night on 4th of July, (59:17) so they were talking about either moving it, (59:20) so it would be either the 3rd, 4th, or 5th. (59:24) Can we make it as nice as possible for them, like, port-a-potties? (59:28) Yes.
 (59:29) Yes. (59:29) We have our walk-around on June 4th, 3rd? (59:36) Yeah. (59:36) So this will be for the softball tournament that we're doing, (59:40) and we're talking about doing, like, the dry camping behind the fields.
 (59:44) But I think that is a great idea. (59:47) We'll do the dumpster, port-a-potties, (59:49) whatever we can to make it accessible (59:52) and hopefully not cause any problems. (59:56) Can you explain what dry camping is to some of the folks here? (1:00:01) So we'll have no sewer.
 (1:00:03) So they don't get any water or what? (1:00:04) Yeah, no sewer or water hookups if we're going to do it. (1:00:07) Like, we don't really have any spots here in town (1:00:09) other than the RV parks itself. (1:00:11) So it would really just be, yeah, no water or sewer hookups.
 (1:00:15) If they could come and wash their dishes. (1:00:16) Or power. (1:00:17) Yeah.
 (1:00:19) Yeah. (1:00:20) We would, yeah. (1:00:21) We're trying to figure out some, like, little details like that, (1:00:25) but I wasn't sure if we were even going forward with it.
 (1:00:28) So I just wanted to ask. (1:00:28) Are you going to have separate spaces? (1:00:31) Or is there going to be a free-for-all? (1:00:33) Is there going to be a fee? (1:00:34) I mean, what's going to be included if there is a fee? (1:00:37) What's going to be their responsibility? (1:00:39) Blah, blah, blah. (1:00:40) So they are

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already paying, from what I believe, (1:00:43) from what I heard from Octavia, (1:00:44) is that they are already going to be paying a fee (1:00:46) for the softball tournament itself.

(1:00:48) So I don't think we would charge a fee for them to come. (1:00:51) I think that we absolutely could mark spots (1:00:53) to make sure that it's not just a carnival back there of RVs. (1:00:58) We have a ton of white marking paint, (1:01:01) so I don't see why we couldn't go out there (1:01:03) and measure out the spots. (1:01:05) That's a good idea. (1:01:06) Yeah. (1:01:07) You're talking about hybrid fields? (1:01:08) Yeah. (1:01:09) Where we just fill in that big hole that's back there? (1:01:12) So their burn pile. (1:01:14) Their burn pile, yeah. (1:01:15) I know there's been talk about moving the burn pile (1:01:17) now that we have a little more area and space (1:01:20) that could be moved out, (1:01:22) but I'm not exactly sure.

(1:01:24) Maintenance isn't here, (1:01:24) so I'm not sure what that is looking like right now. (1:01:26) I just didn't know if they wanted to fill it in or not. (1:01:28) Yeah, and if they didn't, I think we could just cone it off. (1:01:30) We have a ton of barricades. (1:01:31) Yeah, or we could barricade it off. (1:01:32) I just don't want somebody to fall in if that's the thing.

(1:01:34) Yeah. (1:01:34) For safety reasons. (1:01:35) We can fill it in.

(1:01:37) I mean, you can always dig it back up. (1:01:38) Yeah. (1:01:39) I mean, the dirt's right there.

(1:01:39) We can shove it in. (1:01:40) Absolutely. (1:01:41) If we're going to have dry camping back there, (1:01:44) then we need to leave the lights on in one of the fields.

(1:01:47) And that. (1:01:47) Yeah. (1:01:49) So, for safety reasons.

(1:01:50) I think it's fine. (1:01:51) That'll bring in other camps to come in for that, too. (1:01:54) That brings in revenue for the store, for the gas station.

(1:01:58) Also, when we set up the spaces, (1:02:00) we want to get Allen involved so we can get fire equipment in there (1:02:06) and everything we set up appropriately. (1:02:09) We'll just want an egress

So the only concern that Chief Allen, (1:05:11) the fire department, (1:05:12) the only concern that the fire department would have (1:05:14) is make sure that we have ingress and egress, (1:05:17) and if we are going to have anything with campfires, (1:05:20) because when people are camping, (1:05:21) they like to have a little fire when they wind down at night.

(1:05:23) What the rules are, (1:05:24) if we can make sure that we are clear about that, (1:05:26) whether we are... (1:05:28) I would say no. (1:05:28) We're trying to get to 4th of July, (1:05:29) so we're going to have a fire that works, too, (1:05:32) probably along with... (1:05:34) Right. (1:05:34) So we would want to include those in the either you can (1:05:37) or you cannot, you know, (1:05:39) make sure that there's clear definitions. (1:05:41) Oh, we'll have a spot for them to light a fire with, you know, (1:05:44) not... (1:05:45) Designated area. (1:05:47) Designated area. (1:05:48) Yeah.

(1:05:48) We do have those fire pits in our shed, too, (1:05:51) so maybe we can set something up in front of the Simpson Center (1:05:54) and do something like that with them. (1:05:55) Right, and I think about the fire aspect of it. (1:05:58) It needs to be clear (1:05:59) whether we're going to allow them to use wood (1:06:01) or it's going to be no and only propane.

(1:06:05) Propane will be allowed or nothing at all. (1:06:09) So I would just like there to be some black and white (1:06:11) and clarity on that. (1:06:13) Okay.

(1:06:15) Do we have a vote right now on fire? (1:06:21) Allen, what is your thoughts on the propane? (1:06:24) Is that fine for...? (1:06:25) Propane fires are usually in a self-contained apparatus, (1:06:30) so, I mean, that would probably work, (1:06:32) but if the board is wanting to say no on it, (1:06:35) then that is totally their control. (1:06:38) I think if we have things that are set up specifically, (1:06:41) then that's things that we're going to be liable for, (1:06:44) and we're going to make sure that we're taking care of them (1:06:46) rather than having just any Joe Schmo saying, (1:06:48) hey, you know what, let's barbecue, (1:06:50) and everything's out of hand, (1:06:52) and that's going to be on us, and I don't want that. (1:06:55) If it's something that we own, (1:06:56) we obviously don't want that liability (1:06:58) because after, you know, a couple of years or so, (1:07:00) after the softball game, you know... (1:07:02) That's why I said if we come up with something, (1:07:05) you know, different locations for

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the fire pits or whatever, (1:07:08) then we assume that responsibility, (1:07:11) but I don't think that the campers need to have that.

(1:07:17) I don't think so. (1:07:18) Yeah. (1:07:19) I definitely don't think so.

(1:07:22) But the other thing is, too, (1:07:25) as somebody that's an avid camper (1:07:27) that spends a lot of time in dry camps and stuff, (1:07:30) most of your dry camps now, (1:07:32) they will not allow it near the units. (1:07:35) You can have it out in front of the units. (1:07:37) They usually let you have, like, a propane deal, (1:07:40) or they have a community campfire.

Corey with After Hour Security.

Since the last meeting, (1:09:45) I've done lots of digging and looking into (1:09:47) and almost investigating on the data usage and everything. (1:09:51) What I was stating before was correct. (1:09:57) You guys are supplying Internet for the whole town.

(1:10:02) I was looking into random times, (1:10:06) like at the gym and the rec center and stuff at nighttime. (1:10:09) Some nights you have 89 devices online. (1:10:14) So people parking outside, (1:10:17) people in the gym, (1:10:19) they're counting your data.

(1:10:22) So it's not all the fire department? Not all the fire department. (1:10:25) It wouldn't be like they're connecting their music. (1:10:28) It's more than music.

(1:10:29) Well, that's streaming, but yes, that's carpet. (1:10:31) But we don't have 89 people working out in the gym (1:10:34) streaming their music. (1:10:35) Yeah, we don't have 89 people all at one time doing that.

(1:10:37) No, this was total though, (1:10:39) so everything's already set up on the Internet (1:10:44) where it's supposed to be, (1:10:46) your hardwire, your computers, all that stuff. (1:10:51) There's not that many devices (1:10:53) in between the rec center and the gym. (1:10:55) So the additional is, yeah, people.

(1:11:01) People complain about Internet, (1:11:02) but you have got 80 up right now. (1:11:05) The most you were ever seeing, (1:11:06) the most you were ever seeing with Smokey Valley was 25 (1:11:10) on the perfect day. (1:11:12) You're probably around 10 or 12 up.

(1:11:17) So your recommendation? (1:11:20) You need more data. (1:11:21) So there's a couple ways. (1:11:22) I would recommend another head unit.

Or can we make it so that as soon as they're not there, (1:11:34) that they're not linking up? (1:11:35) So there's a lot of things. (1:11:38) So I think it's kind of like an open heyday right now, (1:11:42) and I don't agree with that. (1:11:45) We can fine-tune it.

(1:11:47) We can secure it. (1:11:49) So I can set up guests. (1:11:52) We can have guest password.

Corey suggests Another head unit (1:14:31) and up the data on both, (1:14:33) and we secure your guys' network (1:14:37) and go with the guest password, (1:14:40) and at a minimum, 24-hour changes, (1:14:43) or that can be a discussion (1:14:45) of how often the password's being changed. (1:14:48) Your normal passwords for the employees

Let's up the internet, but let's limit that over there. (1:26:30) Okay.

(1:26:31) And let's order for the fire department. (1:26:34) And let's order for the fire department. (1:26:35) So, just to keep you guys appraised, Chief Stone.

1:26:39) Corey and I got to do a little walk around. We walked through the building, (1:26:42) and he wanted to see what our requirements were (1:26:45) that we needed for this building. 1:40:49) Highway products, the invoices. (1:40:51) Yes. (1:40:51) \$25,000 and what was the other one? (1:40:53) That one's pretty high, too.

1:40:54) So that one was \$25,000 and there should be another one for \$50,000. (1:41:00) \$51,000 and change? (1:41:02) Yes. (1:41:03) So the \$25,000 is for the new boxes on the bed for brush one.

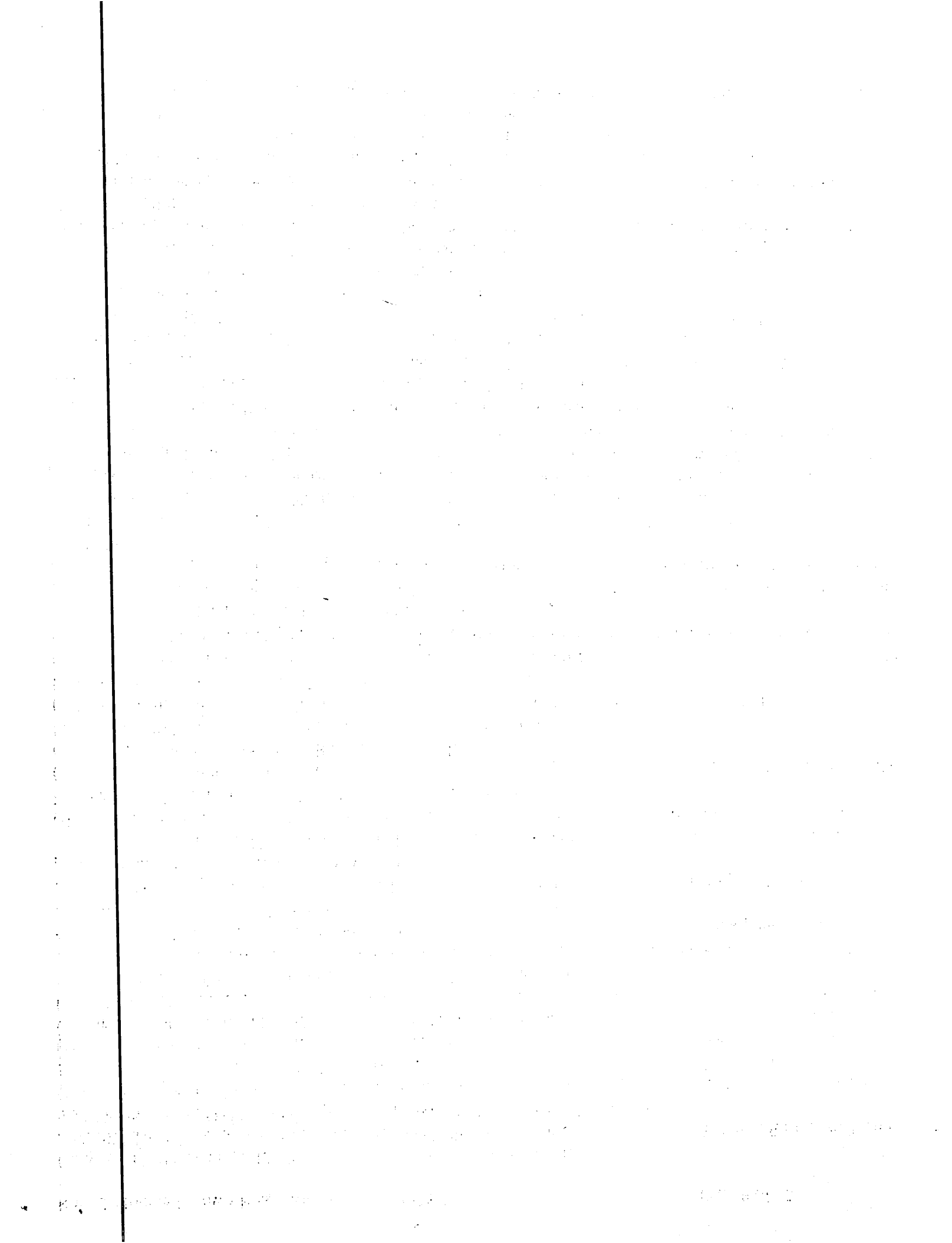

Okay. (1:42:01) Yeah. (1:42:02) So those boxes are on the production line right now.
(1:42:07) The boxes for the bed for the other one is for the bed for command. (1:42:13) One's for his truck and one's for the brush. (1:42:16) Did you get that bed? (1:42:18) The order has been put in.
(1:42:20) The production window on that is going to play here in November, I believe. (1:42:26) This one is due to be delivered. (1:42:29) The boxes for brush one are due to be here on the first part of June.
(1:42:36) The one that we're putting on your truck, Stumpy, (1:42:39) is one we can take off of that truck as well and put into a different one? (1:42:45) Yes, that can be put on any Ford, Chevy, GMC chassis with it (1:42:49) that has the same cab to rear axle measurements. (1:42:55) Once again, no matter what truck that is on, it is warranted for life. (1:43:00) They use a military-grade aluminum.
(1:43:03) They're the only ones in the industry that are using that high-grade aluminum on it. (1:43:07) It's the reason why we have a higher pricing on that. (1:43:10) But I feel that we're paying for that guarantee of if anything ever goes wrong, (1:43:15) they're willing to make it right.
(1:43:21) All that stuff is coming pre-painted, the whole nine yards. (1:43:26) It is literally a plug-and-play. (1:43:28) They've already got the wiring in for the lights.
(1:43:31) What's that? (1:43:32) It's going to be Ford red, which is the Ford Racing Red, (1:43:37) the same color as the brush tube. (1:43:40) It's the same. (1:43:43) Obviously, when that bed comes in, probably in November or December-ish, (1:43:50) the plan is to take the bed off of the truck.
(1:43:54) We're going to ship it out to Fallon or wherever we can get the cab repainted (1:43:59) and repaint the cab and the front clip on that Ford Racing Red. (1:44:03) Then it'll be looking just like the rest of the Ford. (1:44:08) How many miles that truck got on it? (1:44:10) 150.
(1:44:13) Well, when we cross that bridge, I think we ought to look around (1:44:16) and see if we can find one in the last month. (1:44:22) Sure. We can do whatever you need.
(1:44:25) I mean, isn't it senseless to spend a bunch of money on something (1:44:28) that's already got 150,000 miles on it? (1:44:31) It is 16 years old, but it's been a good truck for the department. (1:44:35) No, and we can still use it as a brush tender. (1:44:37) We can use it for many, many things.
(1:44:41) There's a lot of options there. (1:44:45) In fact, in Wyoming, they'd give you a million dollars for that truck. (1:44:49) I'm sure they could go out and- (1:44:51) I think that's James' retirement plan, because he's got one I did.
(1:44:54) I've got one I'll sell you. It's got only 111,000 miles on it. (1:44:58) Oh, it's a new one.

(1:45:29) So the only thing we'll need to add once the bed itself comes in (1:45:34) is we'll need to purchase a light package for the actual emergency lights outside, (1:45:40) but everything else is already pre-wired on the inside.

Chief Stumpf -I'd like to talk to you guys tonight about our Fourth of July.

1:48:26) It's coming up, right? (1:48:29) Miss Lacey and I have been working on this. (1:48:31) If you want to come up, Lacey. (1:48:33) So I wanted to be able to give you guys some different numbers to choose from so that, you know, we just didn't go and come up here and go, hey, this is what we want.

1:48:41) We're not giving you any other ideas. (1:48:42) So Lacey and I came up with a plan here for three different styles of show, and you can see on page two, program A is a \$50,000 mark. (1:48:53) You know, I wanted something, you know, on the high marker and middle and lower.

1:48:57) So that is almost 1,000 shots. (1:49:00) That's a pretty good size show. (1:49:03) The second, program B is, you know, at that \$30,000 range.

1:49:08) And we're looking at, you know, in the \$600 range for the shots and stuff. (1:49:12) That's typically about what we do is in the \$600 range for doing shots. (1:49:18) This year, Lacey and I, we had a lot of blowups on this, and we both felt that it was very important that we get more bang for our buck.

1:49:31) Because we were going with those 10-inch and 12-inches and stuff like that. (1:49:35) They're so ridiculously expensive. (1:49:37) Yes, they're beautiful.

1:50:17) The year before that, we spent in that \$30,000 range. (1:50:21) Okay. (1:50:22) Can I stop you before we vote on this? (1:50:25) Are we good to shoot fireworks? (1:50:27) We are working on that.

1:50:29) My captain is over at the fire marshal's office this week doing some training, (1:50:34) and she went to try to go get her test taken. (1:50:38) That would put us up to two. (1:50:40) Lacey is also going to be going over to take her test.

1:50:43) We've got confirmation for Chromie, as well as my wife Shelby, (1:50:48) to get assistance and stuff like that. (1:50:51) How many do we need? (1:50:52) How many do we need? (1:50:55) We need as many as possible, (1:50:57) because we always get people to show up that day to help with loading, (1:51:01) and we've always been able to write that off as training. (1:51:05) Right now, because we had an injury two years ago, we're still being looked at.

1:51:10) How many people did you actually have versus how many people that are certified to be there? (1:51:15) That's what we're trying to work on is how many people we can get to certify. (1:51:19) I want to try to get that number as high as possible. with five, or no? (1:51:43) We can still produce a show with five. (1:51:46) Okay.

1:51:47) Speaking on the applications, I still haven't heard back. (1:51:53) I sent out 423. (1:51:55) Okay.
