

RESOLUTION - 1872 MINING LAW

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Unincorporated Town of Round Mountain, County of Nye, State of Nevada, at a regular meeting held on the 9th day of April, 1991 at seven o'clock (7:00) p.m. determined that:

WHEREAS, we support the present Mining Law of 1872 and the Multiple Use of Public Lands; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Nation's mineral and timber resources, its economy, and its people have progressed in a sensible manner under the present mining law; and

WHEREAS, the environmental laws and regulations of the State of Nevada are primary and adequately address the environmental concerns of HR 918; and

WHEREAS, a minority of anti-mining groups who underestimate the substantial economic contribution to the United States of America by the mining industry are trying to convince the Congress of the United States to repeal the 1872 Mining Law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of Round Mountain, goes on record as fully supporting the Mining Law of 1872.

AND, FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that this body urges Representative Nick J. Rahall (D-WV) and any other members of the Congress of the United States to cease their repeal attempt on the Mining Law of 1872.
