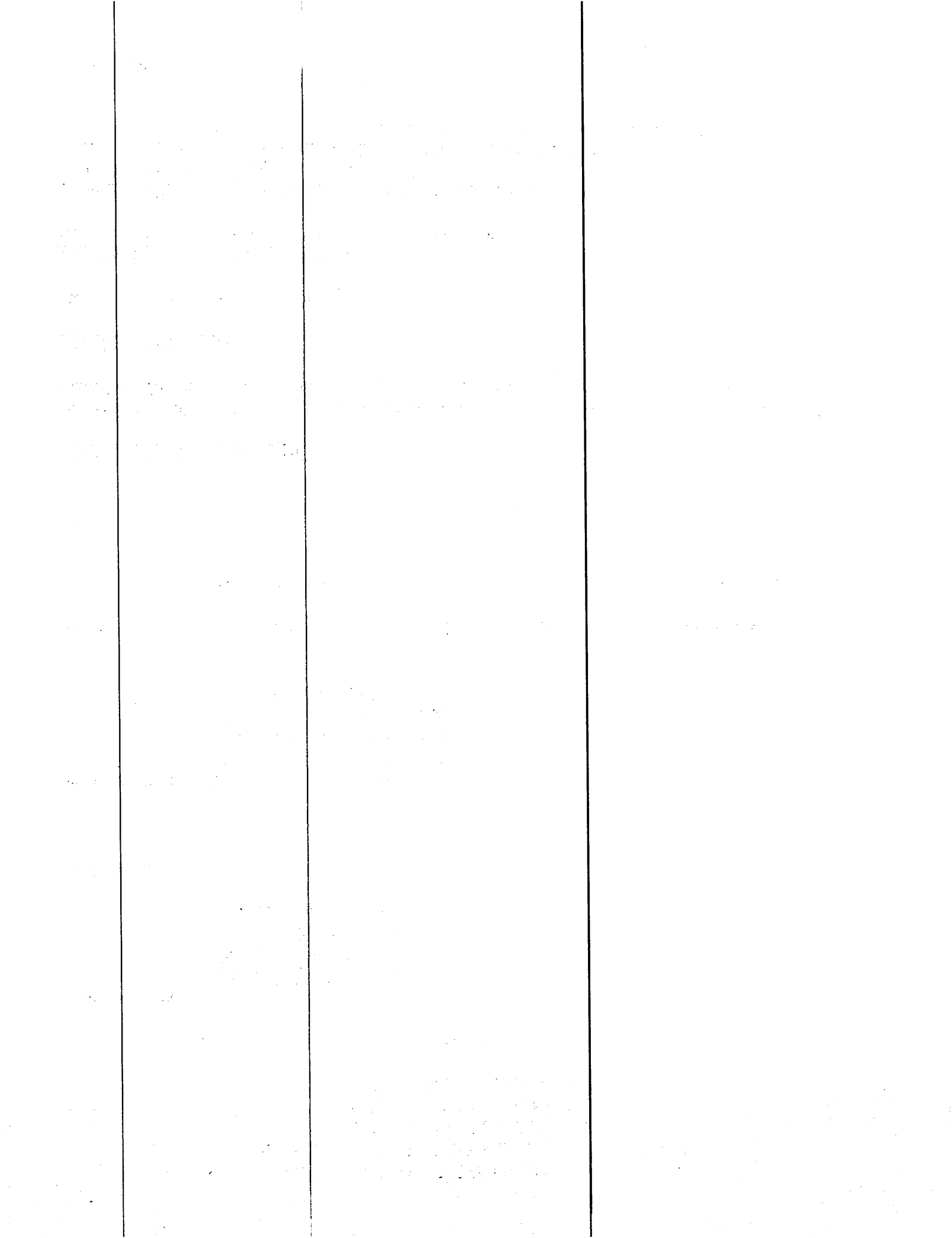

11. Round Mountain Volunteer Fire Department update

Plane recovery mission update – Mission began January 6th, 2025, with search and rescue operations. Mission completed on January 29th, 2025, with multiple agencies involved. Recovery conducted at 11,700 ft elevation, agencies include state emergency management, Nye County Emergency management & Diesel brothers. Footage to be released on You tube.

New fire department helmet equipment- Fire Chief presented new Drager helmet system from Germany costing \$700 per unit. Helmet combines structural fire, wildland fire and rope rescue capabilities. Helmet features include built-in safety harness inner/outer visors, and reflective paint. RMVFD will be testing the helmet before full implementation.

The Drager helmet could replace the current three- helmet system cost \$1,500 per firefighter.

Fire Chaplain introduction- Kevin Sheets introduced as a new fire department chaplain, he is going to be around to provide mental health support for firefighters as well at Town Board members and Town employees. Available for calls at any time, if anyone needs Kevins information go to him or Allen Stumpf (Fire Chief).
