1. Call Meeting to Order/Roll Call.

Sara Sweeney-Chair calls meeting to Order at 5:30 p.m. Roll Call: Sara Sweeney-Chair, Janet Jorgensen, Clerk, Jonathan Appiah, Member

3. GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT. (Up to three-minute time limit per person.) Action will not be Taken by the Board until specifically included on an Agenda as an action item. (First)

Michelle Nelson, "I am here just in my physical capacity. I'm not here at Chief Deputy. I'm not going to be yelling at anyone today. I already got accused of that." Sara Sweeney, "Oh, it's nice to put a face with the name." Michelle Nelson, "And that's why I'm here. I wanted to put faces to names and voices. I am going to stick around for the meeting and afterwards. If anyone would like to talk afterwards." Cori Freidhof, "I am the Nye County Clerk. I just want to throw out a couple of things. We are still doing mail in ballots. I know that there are rumors that are going around, ballots are still being mailed. However, with the Post Office they are changing their rules if you don't have your ballot handed to the Postmaster and marked we are going to count it. The best thing that I can suggest is you come in and drop off your ballot. You can drop off in Tonopah or Pahrump or when we have the election down here." Sweeney, "We usually have the election at the Simpson Center." Freidhof, "Yes, we have it at the Simpson Center. We are looking for election workers. We have are couple of people that we always have but a few people have passed away over the last couple of years. We have applications online. Please if you want to or if you don't want to, it is fun to learn. I will be going through the high school in Tonopah and Pahrump and I'm going to try and hit out here to, to get some of the seniors to come cause it will be soon after graduation and it's a perfect time to learn about elections." Jorgensen, "Have you thought about the job fair that is coming up." Freidhof, "I am going to try to make an appearance. I don't have a table." Jorgensen, "That might be a

good place to make an appearance at.” Freidhof, “I do want to get out there just because right now we are just busy. Today I just proofed the ballots. So, the ballots are out there and they are going. The sample ballots will be mailed at the end of this month. The official ballots will probably be mailed about the 11th of May. The voting starts June 3rd. If you guys do end up coming into town otherwise we will have election day even if I’m not here on June 9th. So, please if you guys have any questions please call me you can call the office. The rumors are not true so don’t listen to them.”

6. (For Possible Action) Approval of March 24, 2026, Meeting Minutes.

Appiah makes a Motion to Approve March 24, 2026; Jorgensen Seconded; Passed 3-0

7. (For Possible Action) Discussion and Deliberation and Possible Decision to Review Ordinance #18.

Swigart, “Madame Chair with the new meters coming in and the new enhance system. I thought that this Ordinance needed to be reviewed again by the board. There were some miss understandings when I first took the job it was right at the end of Covid. The board had developed Ordinance 18. There has been some question whether or not you could shut off someone’s water and there was some outstanding bills out there with the way the system was set up. One individual with RMGC owned \$245,000 and he only had \$63.00 in his bank account. So, it wasn’t going to work out. I made a manager decision there. And then it got to the point where some people in town thought that they could get free water and not pay there bill even though they got there bill every month. So, we sent out 42 door knockers hangers letting them know that they were in real trouble.” Jorgensen, “Have we had good response with that?” Swigart, “Yes, that was a good response. I think it’s worth looking at that Ordinance again. Not flying by light now. And having everyone look at it and seeing if there is anything we want to tweak or change, including myself and Maci. Maci has some ideas how she wants it and make it simpler and easier. I don’t think there is no better time then right now with the new meters coming in.” Swigart, “And we are looking at payments and billing? Is that what we are looking at? Is that our main concern? That’s on page 35.” Curiel, “Yes, I would like to go back to the way it was. Where you get penalized after one month and a turned off and turned back on fee?” Sweeney, “I would like to see the fee to go up to whatever it cost us? If it cost us \$50.00 to have two staff employees to go do it or whatever that is. That’s what they are going to have to pay. Cause it does cost us money.” Curiel, “I don’t think \$15.00 is going to cover it.” Sweeney, “I would like to see that go up.” Yost, “We did have the assessment done prior to these meters. They took into consideration insurance breakdown and hourly wage for us to go turn off a meter it was like \$36.00. That would be a good number for you guys to start at.” Jorgensen, “So, I think everything needs to be looked at from a surcharge for the past due. But not only when they have to turn off the meter but also turn it back on and even the door knockers. This is all out of our pocket. That we need to recoup somehow.” Swigart, “I agree. You guys take a look at it between now and then we will put in on the next agenda. See if there is any positive ideas that you can come up with.” Appiah, “In the meantime let’s not let this happen again, two hundred and something thousand dollars, why it even got to this point before we even caught it. It just blows my mind. We need to make sure that we are catching things like this and addressing it and not letting it slip by. My question is with the new system how many people we need if we needed to shut off someone’s meter?” Yost, “With the new system and the shut off and the turn on is still going to be the same. The meter itself is upgraded but we didn’t upgrade the valves. So, it will still be two people and that’s just the way we have ran it is, people around town don’t like there water shut off right? We have one guy shutting off the water and one guy watching. It’s about the safety way we can do it. That’s the way we have been doing it and that’s the way I would like to continue to do it.” Jorgensen, “I agree with that.” Sweeney, “Absolutely.” Swigart, “Even the door knockers it’s a little uncomfortable it’s better to have someone with you.”

S. Cromie, "Jim and I didn't have anyone with us." Sweeney, "You went all by yourself?" S. Cromie, "Yes." Swigart, "We did about 42. Like Joe said if we stay on top of this we aren't going to have 42." Jorgensen, "But even if you have one we still need to maintain the safety. I think two should go." Swigart, "I think me and Cody Bennett should go. Have you seen how big that guy is?" Jorgensen, "He's like a bouncer." Jorgensen makes a motion to continue item #7 until the next meeting on April 28th; Appiah Seconded; Approved 3-0

8. (For Possible Action) Discussion and Deliberation and Possible Decision to Accept Tentative Budget.

Swigart, "Dan McArthur and Hillary notified us that the six revenue streams that come in to the Town of Round Mountain are slightly less than they have been in the last few years. So, he trimmed some things on it. But he was very commendable to the town board and the way you guys worked the town budget this year. There are a few little things that you can't even notice. He left the \$250,000 for the real estate development and for possibly the 49.84 acres we get from the mine. It was just in some areas. It was basic. It's just the tentative and we can work it a little. He's suppose to get a hold of me on Thursday and call me and review it and explain why some of the numbers are done that we receive tax wise." Sweeney, "But we need to sign it tonight right?" Swigart, "Yes, it needs to be signed tonight cause we have to mail it off tomorrow." Appiah, "I'm glad that he is going to discuss this cause I would like to know the areas that come up." Swigart, "He said that he would call me and soon as I get those numbers before the final budget. I will let you know. I will have him highlight it and let you know the numbers that he trimmed. I don't know how many accounts he deal's with." Appiah, "Let us know as far as." Swigart, "I'll let you know at the next meeting, ok. The one thing that really jumped out at me is the public works where we charge for water we lose about \$250,000 a year because we just don't charge enough to even break even. No one wants the thought of raising their water and sewer but it might be something we have to do. In Carver's area it's \$100 a month for water." Sweeney, "Does the average person not pay that?" Curiel and S. Cromie, "The minimum is \$50.00." Sweeney, "Oh, at my house we use a lot of water." Swigart, "It's just something that we may want to look at. You have to go in front of the board and you have to have the all different areas. Heidi tried to explain it to me once but I couldn't figure it out." Appiah, "Maybe if we don't let anyone's bill get up to \$200 that's revenue that we can make for the loss." Swigart, "Right." Curiel, "I know when we were doing the meters people were making sure we weren't raising the rates." Appiah, "But if we are able to curve the free water that's being given out." Appiah makes a motion to approve the tentative budget; Jorgensen Seconded; Approved 3-0

9. (For Possible Action) Discussion and Deliberation and Possible Decision for Firework Fundraising.

Sweeney, "We did talk about it at the last meeting about putting it out to the community and it could be advertised that they could come into the town office or the recreation center and people could sponsor a firework to a loved one. Sort of a firework is worth this much money. Whatever it is?" R. Cromie, "That sounds good." Sweeney, "I think we were calling it "Lights of Love"." Swigart, "Yes, Lights of Love." \ R. Cromie, "I know you guys talked about it, about doing the fundraiser for the fireworks. I wish I had more time to do this but I just don't." Swigart, "I recommend that we put on a golf tournament for the fire department for the fireworks. We can call it, "The Firecracker or Firework's Tee Off." Sweeney, "Maci we did talk about them being able to come into the office and paying. That is something that can be done right?" Curiel, "Yes." Sweeney, "So, that's not something you need to have the man power to do." Jorgensen, "I want them to be able to go into the recreation center also." R. Cromie, "So, did we decide on a price?" Sweeney, "That's something that we should talk about tonight. What do we think is a fair amount for a firework? I don't think people are going to cover the whole price of a firework. Anything we get is better than nothing." R. Cromie, "I agree a 100%." Sweeney, "I think we will sell more if it's a reasonable cost." Jorgensen, "Is there different one's to pick and choose from?" R. Cromie, "Yes so we have 3", 4", 5" and 6" shells. So, you can make start at." Jorgensen, "Can we do increments of \$5?" R. Cromie, "Yes, so we can start at \$20 and go up to \$25, \$30 and \$35.00." Sweeney, "And then can you give them a number and tell them you are firework #1, #2, and so on." S. Cromie, "Yes. We get do a list for the different sizes and have them numbered." Jorgensen, "Then if we do that they will have to pay you." Curiel, "Yes, cash or check." Jorgensen, "They will have to go to the town office not the recreation center." Curiel, "We can do both." Jorgensen, "If she has the list they won't be

able to issue a number.” Curiel, “Oh, that’s correct.” Jorgensen, “So, they will have to come to the town office.” Swigart, “Or we can get the names and issue them later?” Sweeney, “The town office is more consistently open because you’re not going between multiple buildings.” Salo, “Can you do it by color too?” R. Cromie, “I have no idea what color they are until coming out.” Salo, “They don’t tell you?” R. Cromie, “They come in a box and we just start letting them off.” S. Cromie, “How many different sizes are there, four? Starting with 3?” R. Cromie, “Yes, 3”, 4”, 5” and 6”. We are not going any bigger than 6” this year. The cost of the 8” is twice as much as the 6”. It just doesn’t make sense.” S. Cromie, “Can you tell me how many of each size shot we have?” R. Cromie, “ 3”-220 shots; 4-180 shots; 5”-180; 6”-99 and then the finale shots those are lot more involved. Those are chains of 10’s, 5’s and 4’s.” Jorgensen makes a motion to approve the Lights of Love Firework fundraiser; Appiah Seconded; Approved 3-0

10. (For Possible Action) Review and Approve Invoices for the Town of Round Mountain for the April 14, 2026, Meeting.

Sweeney, “Do you need me to recuse myself because my son Andrew was a wrestler and we paid the registration fee for him? We don’t have a quorum without me.” Swigart, “How much is it?” Sweeney, “\$200.” Curiel, “Michelle we have a question for you. So, we need a quorum and we have a USA Wrestling invoice and her son was included in that.” Sweeney, “So, my son was a wrestler through the town and the town paid his registration fee.” Curiel, “It was like maybe \$20.00 for her son.” Jorgensen, “I don’t think you need to recuse yourself.” Sweeney, “I don’t know. I have recused myself for lots of other things that he has been. He is my child.” Michelle Nelson, “I’m not permitted to speak on behalf of the D.A. Office as the Chief Deputy District Attorney but just as an individual. It’s my understanding that as long as you wouldn’t have a biquinary interest and still able to remain neutral then there would need to be a disclosure in which case you would make your disclosure and say that you don’t have any biquinary interest and remain neutral and that you would be still voting on the item or not. That is up to you.” Sweeney, “But I pay for him to participate.” Jorgensen, “She paid for the registration so I don’t feel like she needs to do that.” Sweeney, “I just want to be on the up and up on everything.” Nelson, “There should always be a disclosure.” Sweeney, “My son is a wrestler on the wrestling team but I paid for him to wrestle.” Nelson, “That is my understand as long as you can remain neutral.” Sweeney, “What’s this google for business up keep?” Curiel, “I look it up and it said business up keep but it is for the emails.” Sweeney, “Did we have to make new email?” Curiel, “No, that’s for not the licensing cause that’s in November but that’s for you can say the monthly fee. I think. I can ask Corey for more clarification but.” Sweeney, “Is that through Corey or someone else.” Curiel, “It’s to Google but Corey like handles it.” Jorgensen, “Can we get some more information on that?” Curiel, “Yes, I will ask.” Jorgensen, “Because if it’s a monthly this is the first time.” Curiel, “No it’s been on there every time.” Yost, “The USA Wrestling was only for those kids that took part in that. The town didn’t pay for his because he wasn’t part of that.” Sweeney, “So, the town didn’t pay for his. Then my daughter was a wrestler. One more question that email in invoice it’s in here?” Curiel, “Yes it’s in my bank statement.” S. Cromie, “It is on her bank statement every month.” Sweeney, “I don’t remember seeing this every month. This John Deere one did we approve that already?” Swigart, “Yes, I’m going to get a hold of John Deere cause we should have a \$2,000 credit.” Sweeney, “Did we get invoiced already for the clay?” S. Cromie, “No, we haven’t gotten an invoice for the clay yet.” Yost, “I printed off what she sent me.” S. Cromie, “And that wasn’t the invoice it said, “Delivery Confirmation”. I have everything on my desk and I will double check but pretty sure it wasn’t the invoice. Because what I received if it doesn’t say “Invoice” on it and I were to code it and give it to Maci she’s going to tell me that this isn’t the invoice.”

Jorgensen makes a motion to Approve the Invoices for the Town of Round Mountain for April 14, 2026 in the amount of \$131,064.36; Appiah Seconded; Approved 3-0

11. Recreation Department Update (Discussion Only)

Swigart, “Recreation Department is out this week. We are handling everything in office at the front desk and Maintenance Department is helping out with anything that is going on this week. We have A.R.T. going on this week. I want to say that there is something else going on down there this week or weekend.” Sweeney, “We had opening day this past weekend.” Swigart, “Yes and that went really well. Everyone was really

impressed with the ball fields.” Sweeney, “The grass has never looked so good. Great Job Maintenance.”

12. Maintenance Department Update (Discussion Only).

Yost, “I just have a couple of things for you guys. First tank is done and touched up. The big boss and Engineer cleared everything this last week. They will possibly we out this next week along with the sanitation crew. Then I will get with them and get an exact date when we are starting on the second tank. So, that opens up our big tank back up. There will be a couple of hours where we are strictly running on the VFD do to the way those tanks were plugged in to drain the little tank we have to tank both tanks offline but once it’s drain I can bypass back to the big drain. Without a day running on any tanks.” Sweeney, “Sorry, but this won’t interfere with anyone’s water in town.” Yost, “No. So, what that is going to is. What the VFD does it keeps everything pressurized to a certain PSI cutting the tanks just means that the VFD will be running. So, when 17 people turn water on at the same time it will kick on to keep the pressure. Just as a per caution we are buying a blow off valve for the fire hydrant so if it ever decided it went to high and the VFD didn’t kick off then it will blow off on the fire hydrant and not someone sink. That will be a little expensive but I feel like it’s a necessity. Meter wise on my side of the house. I’m don’t know exactly how billing is going but they are in the process of buying all of our meters. They came out and did an initial survey that narrowed it down on a couple of meters they are going to go with to make our original pipes fit and stuff. He did say that all of our meters for residential they are only a couple weeks out cause they have a whole warehouse full of them. It’s the commercial ones that they are trying to get.” Curiel, “And they are still working on licensing.” Yost, “Yes, and they are still working on licensing so that’s taking a little bit longer than they anticipated but that’s really all. They bought all the licensing for our tanks. So, as far as I know nothing is needed from us. A lot of water leaks and a lot of prep for opening day. As of tomorrow, at least on our side both pools will be back up both pools will be ready to go maintenance wise. The pumps are running good the heater is running.” Sweeney, “Did you guys recalk that siding?” Yost, “No not yet strictly cause that is not going to stop us from opening. We were focusing on draining the pools. That will be the next thing we will be doing down there. We did fix a bunch of plumbing down there. We are having some major issues going on with sinks that have been going on for years. Bandages have just been thrown at it so we just re-did the whole plumbing today actually. We got a list to re-run the hot water but that wasn’t going to stop us from opening.” Appiah, “Can you get us pictures of the tanks after they have been done? I still has PTSD from seeing the before.” Yost, “I will get you pictures when we are up there. They still need to sanitize and stuff. So, I will make sure we get after pictures before the next board meeting. I hope they will start it before the next boarding meeting but they are also backed up and probably a week or two out. He just told me where we are at right here and right now. But he will be here sometime this next week face to face with me. We do have mid-way pictures and the originals and then of course we will have these.” Swigart, “How is the scoreboard in the gym?” Yost, “The scoreboard in the gym is put up and working. I’m happy.” Sweeney, “It is. That was fast.” Yost, “We just needed a little electrical assistant.” Swigart, “How about the white park for the 4th of July?” Yost, “The white park we are pretty proud of it’s looking how it ended last year. So, that month that we were waiting on parts for sprinklers just about killed us. Right now, we have two really small dry patches. We are mowing once a week right now and it’s looking nice. However, we did talk to our fertilizer, weed killer guy again and he is dead set that we need to take the trees in the middle out. I know that everyone has always said that the trees have always been there but they are getting bigger and we have tripled the fertilizer in that park from three years ago.” Sweeney, “Can we prune them?” Yost, “We can but his issue is that 90% of the fertilizer we are throwing down the trees are stealing it.” Swigart, “If you took out the middle trees you would have more open area.” Yost, “I think I counted five trees we were going to leave all the outside trees and just take out the middle trees and the stumps the kids can actually play ball or something. Right now, it’s just a place to lounge. Just so you know that it is coming eventually. Every time he shows up he says it’s the trees. He says there is nothing to talk about here.” Sweeney, “People just use them for shade.” Yost, “If we just leave the outside trees there will still be a good amount of shade there. I don’t think taking out the middle trees is going to affect anything. You still have the outer trees where the sun is hitting right. If we want it to be fantastic and perfect like someone else wants then that’s our option. Eventually the trees are going to have to go just the middle ones. Anything else I am forgetting Jim?” Swigart, “Just the clubhouse update.” Yost, “Clubhouse

update. We had a little mishap with the contractor. He's making it right so it's not that big of a deal. We ran a trench of to the clubhouse. He was supposed to come last week and run a wire and hook up everything for us him missed that or our substation right there is 480 so we had to buy a transformer. He found one and he's eating that cost but this just pushes us out two weeks. We caught it before he came down with all his equipment. So, we caught it no hard no foul. He's going to cover the transformer when it comes in and then he will come out and do the job." Appiah, "Have you heard anything about the HVAC?" Yost, "I have not. I was going to reach out to them this week. They did ask for a max occupancy for the building. I gave that to them but I haven't heard back yet. But we are still in the works for that. Every is running down there right now, we have been keeping it at 70 degrees. It might get warm down there in a little bit. It made it through the winter and what these guys were able to do for us. I never got an invoice for that. That I know of for that. So, I got to look at getting us the right unit and pointing us in the right direction." Sweeney, "Jim, I can't remember but I wanted to know the update on the new cardio equipment for the gym?" Yost, "That would be recreation but I have the date for that. They pushed it but it's supposed to be on the 27th." Sweeney, "Ok." Appiah, "So, I went to the cardio room and there was a treadmill that had a tag on it, to tag it out. I went back in the following day or so and someone had plugged it back in. So, I had contacted one of the maintenance crew member's to come and remove the cables or whatever. So, there was no hazardous violations.

13. Round Mountain Volunteer Fire Department Update (Discussion Only).

R. Cromie, "So, we are holding strong we have 12 adult firefighters, 5 juniors and 4 support members. Hopefully we can get some more people but we are holding strong and that makes me happy. We have been working on rope training once a month trying to get everyone ready for classes that are coming up in July and August. He are working on getting our permit for fireworks for the town and then starting May 1st we can start testing. We will be sending people to Carson City to get there Operator or Assistant permits. I got with maintenance and they are going to help me get a quote for the backup generator for the grant that we are working on and also with that we are working on getting a quick response EMS vehicle/Command 21 with the EMS grant. I have to finish getting those quotes together and get those sent over next week. The grant opens up on April 30th. I need to get everything in by the 20th and submitted and hopefully we will be lucky. Also I am working with maintenance to get all our fireworks supply area get all cleaned up cause I want to pull all the old mortar tubes out of the ground and get up their with the tool cat or something and get it all leveled out and then dig new trenches in there to remount everything. A lot of our racks are just falling apart. So, I just need to get some wood and build some racks for the mortar tubes.

14. Golf Course Update (Discussion Only).

Swigart, "Course looks fantastic. We have had a lot of people out there. We are close to \$9,000.00. We are close to probably 22 or 23 memberships sold. If you guys pull up your little card flyer these are all over the town and we are going to put them in Tonopah. On the back of your card, take your phone and zoom in on that QR code. I didn't know what QR stands for until Josh told me. Josh?" Yost, "Quick Response." Swigart, "All of you out of towners can grab one. We got some quotes back from Ben Dotson on the clubhouse to do the inside of it. Some new flooring, laminate, painting and do the skirting on the outside to build a 32 foot deck by 8 on the east side and there will be a ramp that goes up to both doors and there will be a desk up there. It's going to look really nice and it's going to put us under the budget. The westside that faces the golf course the deck and the front door that we wanted to put in. We are going to wait until next year just so we don't go over budget. Dan McArthur is very disappointed in me and all of us. Like the Chief said we will mail off letters to shoot off fireworks here in Hadley on the 4th. We will mail those to Sam Takit. Thank you Cori. Went in front of the board last Tuesday. There was 1.7 million dollars I guess they had lying around. Commissioner Baine from Pahrump wanted to distribute that to all of the firefighters in Pahrump and the EMS people which would have been about \$300.00 individually a month for those people. But we kind of stepped in and wanted to bring in the North and all the volunteers. Bruce Jabbour was instrumental and his oration that he gave to the Commissioners was amazing. I talk to them about the Round Mountain history and in 2011 the Smoky Valley Volunteer Fire Department which was a county fire department of about 20

people and then you had Round Mountain Volunteer Fire Department with about 25 people out here. Well there membership dropped off and they disband and Round Mountain took over the whole Valley. I spoke with Dan Sweeney and I asked him if he got any kind of compensation when you did that and he said, "No, it was just the right thing to do. To provide patient care and fire coverage for the whole community". So, they kind of bought in and they thought including the volunteers they weren't sure how they were going to distribute that and it was coming to \$190.00 a month including all the volunteers in Tonopah, Beatty and so forth. One of the Commissioners mentioned that Nye County was 1.8 million dollars over budget currently at that time. So, they kind of backed away from it and they were going to look into it. But we are going to try and make sure that any retention incentive that the volunteers are included.
